## Absentee voting law benefits all voters (including busy parents)

Michigan's voting law makes it even easier for all registered voters in the Allen Park Public School District to vote on the upcoming May 4th bond proposal.

Registered voters can cast an absentee ballot in our school district's \$74.215 million **no** tax rate increase May 4th bond election after March 20th through Election Day.

Absentee ballot applications are available now. Absentee ballots will be available after March 20th.

### Here are three easy steps to voting by absentee ballot:

- 1. Get an absentee ballot application in any school office, or from the City of Allen Park Clerk's Office, or online at www.michigan.gov/vote.
- 2. Complete the application and mail it to the City of Allen Park Clerk's Office.
- 3. After March 20th, absentee ballots will be mailed to those who apply for them as well as to residents on the City of Allen Park's Permanent Absentee Voter List. Simply complete the ballot and return it before 8 p.m. on May 4th to the City of Allen Park Clerk's Office by mail or by using the drop box located at the Allen Park City Offices.

#### Here's what is on the May 4th ballot:

The Allen Park Public School District has placed a \$74.215 million, **no tax-rate increase** bond proposal on the May 4th ballot.

#### The bond proposal was designed to:

- upgrade the learning environment, including enhancing equipment and instructional spaces for robotics instruction and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math);
- upgrade technology equipment and infrastructure;
- upgrade athletic fields and facilities;
- upgrade facility infrastructure, including electrical and mechanical systems;
- replace paving and parking lots; and,
- purchase school buses in 2021, 2023, and 2025.
